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- Always refer to your hospital's <u>Policy and Procedure Manuals</u> for detailed information.
- Your hospital's adult <u>Critical Ranges</u> has been programmed to <u>below 40 mg/dl</u> OR <u>above 400 mg/dl</u> (the meter will alert you when you when you have a critical test result).



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## *"TWIST, PULL AND SHOOT "*



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Hold the lancet and twist off the protective lancet cap. (DO NOT use if cap has previously been removed.)



## "TWIST, PULL AND SHOOT"



Hold the lancet and twist off the protective lancet cap. (DO NOT use if cap has previously been removed.)



Place the lancet against the fingertip and press the blue button. <u>AFTER USE</u>, <u>PLEASE DISPOSE IN</u> <u>SHARPS CONTAINER</u>.



## How to Dose the ACCU-CHEK Comfort Curve <u>Test Strip</u>



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Lance the <u>side</u> of the finger, wipe off the first drop of blood (and any residual alcohol) with dry gauze. Then obtain a drop of blood.

Lance the <u>side</u> of the finger, wipe off the first drop of blood (and any residual alcohol) with dry gauze. Then obtain a drop of blood. With the strip is inserted into the meter, touch and hold the edge of the yellow window and blood should totally fill the yellow window.

AFTER THE INFORM BEEPS THE REACTION HAS STARTED and you have up to 15 seconds to apply more blood to the strip, if the yellow window is not totally filled.































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- The meter has been programmed to "Remind" you to download and will eventually "Lock" you out if you have not downloaded.
- Your hospital's normal <u>Range</u>, <u>Out of Normal Range</u>, and <u>Out of Critical Range</u> have been programmed into the meter with a special message under each test result (see next slide).







<u>RANGE (NORMAL)</u>: Values seen for a healthy adult population.

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<u>CRITICAL VALUES RANGE</u>: <u>ORDER STAT LAB DRAW</u>. Your hospital's range is below 40 mg/dl and above 400 mg/dl. The ACCU-CHEK Inform meter will remind you that this result is "Out of Critical Range", a "Comment" is required and display your hospital policy.

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<u>ACCU-CHEK Inform VALID READABLE RANGE</u>: Values that the ACCU-CHEK Inform will report a valid result (10 mg/dl to 600 mg/dl). A result <u>below 10 mg/dl will report</u> <u>a "LO"</u> and a result <u>above 600 mg/dl will report a "HI</u>".

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• <u>MAKE SURE THE LASER BEAM COVERS THE WHOLE BARCODE, THE BARCODE</u> <u>IS AS FLAT AS POSSIBLE AND THE BEAM IS NOT CURVED (ESPECIALLY WITH</u> <u>PATIENT WRISTBANDS)</u>:

To turn the meter on, press and <u>release</u> the *Purple Power Button*. The meter will perform self-checks after power-up for about 7 seconds (will beep when done).

Press the Forward Arrow Button to get to the "Operator ID" screen

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<u>Press and release</u> the "Scan" button to turn on bar code reader.

Position the Inform <u>4 to 6 inches</u> away from your bar-coded badge ID and scan it (scanner will stay on for about 8 seconds), OR ...

#### **Operator IDs**

Your operator ID is your employee ID with enough leading zeros to equal 10 digits. <u>This is what is</u> <u>coded on your bar-coded badge</u>. Student IDs are the letter "S" plus the last 4 digits of their SS#.





Position the Inform <u>4 to 6 inches</u> away from your bar-coded badge ID and scan it (scanner will stay on for about 8 seconds), OR ...

If the keyboard is displayed, you may also input your 10 digit operator ID number manually, then press the *Forward Arrow Button* to enter it.

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First "Scan" the <u>control bottle</u> and <u>then the strip vial</u> for each control test (in <u>ANY</u> order you choose). The ACCU-CHEK Inform meter will <u>automatically run that level control</u>. It is a good practice to <u>only remove the quality control bottle you are actually running</u>.

Input the 7 digit patient account number by scanning their bar-coded wristband,





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OR, <u>if the keyboard is displayed</u>, you may also manually input the 7 digit patient account number in the *"Patient ID"* screen and when complete, press the *Forward Arrow Button to enter it.*

### **Miscellaneous Information**

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- When using arterial samples, make sure the lines are properly flushed before dosing the test strip.



• If cleaning is required, you may either use alcohol, a <u>damp</u> cloth with a soapy solution or a 10% bleach wipe (to disinfect). <u>Do not saturate the meter</u>.

• For isolation patients, cover the meter with a hazardous waste plastic bag and follow the current infection control policy.

• Make sure the meter is <u>dry after cleaning</u> before placing in the docking station.

• If a replacement meter is needed, please contact the laboratory or your point of care coordinator in the laboratory for a replacement. Roche will replace the meters, accessory boxes or docking stations at no charge.

• The test strip expiration date is listed on the side of the vial. To ensure quality, tightly secure the lid on the strip vial after each use.

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• Never attempt to replace the battery (it is rechargeable).

## **Meter Troubleshooting Tips**



*Tips regarding docking and un-docking the meter:* 



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- When the meter is docked, always make sure the <u>green light on the docking station is on</u>. If it is blinking, immediately remove the meter to make sure the meter and/or the base are not wet from cleaning. If they are wet, promptly dry them.



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### If you have any issues with the meter not responding, you may reset the meter. TO RESET THE ACCU-CHEK INFORM METER:



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- The meter will tell you it has been reset, then ask you to verify the date and time. <u>YOU MUST</u> <u>DOCK THE METER IN A WORKING DOCKING STATION IF THE DATE/TIME ARE INCORRECT</u>.
